Dorm style living with weekly rate as \$80.00 per week (Housing Fee) and shall be deducted from Employee's paycheck during Employee's seasonal term of employment with CIC. All utilities included in fee (including internet, electric, water, trash removal, maintenance, etc.). Said deduction shall be in increments of \$160.00 per paycheck (bi-weekly) with a one-time, non-refundable cleaning fee of \$100.00 (\$25 deduction out of first four paychecks). Average two person per room. Paired with roommate in same work department or similar work schedule (unless roommate is requested). Facility is co-ed, but rooms are not. Remodeled motel with air conditioning, some kitchen utensils, microwave, refrigerator, single bed per student, bedding, pillow, shared bathroom. Clothing washer and dryers onsite and free to use. Location is approximately one mile from worksite – students use provided bicycles and safety gear as transportation. CIC will provide shuttle transportation if poor weather (i.e. rainstorm). Paired with roommate in same work department or similar work schedule. We provide a transportation pick up service from Cleveland, OH and Detroit, MI airports between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM If flight lands out of the time frame student will need to get a hotel for the evening.

Arrival Instructions:

There are two options for your travel to Catawba Island, Ohio

- 1. Employer suggests flying into <u>Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (CLE)</u> which is closer (1-hour drive time) to Catawba Island Club and has flight options from larger east coast arrival cities.
- 2. A second option Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport (DTW). This airport may offer better direct international flights, but is an additional 1-hour drive time from Catawba Island.

Arrival/Departure - students MUST email their arrival information to Marci Timerding, CIC program coordinator (mtimerding@cicclub.com) at least 2-weeks prior to arriving to the United States. Details about a scheduled pickup will be communicated to the student prior to their departure.

- students arriving between 8 am and 5 pm will be picked up at no charge by CIC.
- students arriving between 6 pm and 7 am are recommended to book a room at a nearby hotel with airport shuttles (list below) and transportation to CIC will be arranged for the next day.

CIC Prefers that students arrive on Monday through Thursday. Arrival Friday through Sunday is possible though the student may experience additional delays in being taken to the grocery store.

Arrival by train - the closest train station to CIC is in Sandusky, Ohio. Students who choose to fly to an airport along the east coast (New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, etc.) and take a train should plan to arrive to Sandusky. They will picked-up in Sandusky and brought to CIC.

*CIC will provide transportation to the local Social Security office at no charge.

*CIC will provide transportation from the airport to CIC at the beginning of the program, and will provide transportation back to the airport at the end of the program

Grooming Requirements:

Participant must be showered and clean each day for their shift. Hair must always be pulled back in bun or back braid, facial hair is allowed but must be trimmed and neat (hair can't exceed 1/4 inch in length), no dangling earrings (only studs or non-hanging earrings allowed), no necklaces or bracelets, only wedding band can be worn during work shift, no nail polish, acrylics, shellac, gel, etc..
